




- I wanted to make something that could be moved like a toy using multiple matchboxes.

We have also created colouring pages and pages for children to design their own dresses.





































Later, I learnt about the big swallowtail





Process


A mould is made from oil clay and plaster, then dozens of small pieces of torn Japanese paper are pasted on top of each other.















Experiment

Created a story with these miniature shoes as characters.

• Story: Once upon a time, there was a princess who loved shoes. No matter how good the shoemaker made her shoes, she was never satisfied, so one day she threw them at the shoemaker.

From that moment on, everything she touched turned into shoes. To be continued.

Mika-chan to Capone : Award

This picture book won 17th place in Hakusensha's "Picture Book Store Award 2011" (February 2012).

The award is organised by the monthly magazine MOE (specialising in introducing picture books/Hakusensha) and is decided once a year by votes from booksellers throughout Japan. Thirty works are selected each year. In Japan, about 1000 picture books are published a year, so it is wonderful to be selected for this award.
